In response to page 6 of BMV magazine I write to oppose any development in Stalbridge at this time.

Stalbridge is a town which at the moment doesn't have the infrastructure to support massive residential development.

There is a lack of suitably payed employment mainly because of the influx of eastern European workers. The school is full and unable to take in more children without being extended. The surgery offering NHS care is threatened with closure, we have only one dedicated doctor who is anxious to retire.

The A357 through the town is inadequate to safely cope with the extra traffic which is inevitable. There is a lack of shopping facilities, shops are closing and there isn't a bank in the town, even a charity shop recently closed because of a decline in demand.

Recreational facilities are minimal and apart from a fish and chip shop, kebab shop and chinese takeaway there is nowhere to get a meal and socialise in the evenings.

I would not be opposed to large  
scale development if the infrastructure  
was improved.
