Natural England have no objection to the Fontmell Magna Neighbourhood Plan and wish to make the below specific comments.

Natural England welcome the inclusion of a policy on local wildlife corridors and protected species and have the below recommendations for this policy and the site allocation policies;

- Amend text to show the updated name of "Biodiversity Mitigation and Enhancement Plan".
 This better indicates the requirement of development to enhance the natural environment, in line with NPPF paragraphs 7, 109 and 118.
- The Dorset Biodiversity Protocol is recommended for all sites over 0.1ha or where there is likely adverse impact to biodiversity and as such we suggest the policy contain wording to state that plots over 0.1ha will be required to complete a BMEP
