



Reasons a House to House licence may be refused;-

- The total amount that the charity receives is inadequate in proportion to the total proceeds of the collection. The Authority's policy is that this should be 75% of the proceeds to the charity or cause.
- There is excessive remuneration paid to the collectors out of the proceeds. The Authority's policy is that no more than 25% of the proceeds may be deducted.
- There is likely to be an offence committed under the Vagrancy Act 1824.
- That the applicant is not a fit and proper person.
- That the applicant has not taken sufficient steps to ensure the people collecting on his behalf are fit and proper persons.
- The applicant has refused to supply the Authority with any information that they have reasonably requested to satisfy the matters above.
